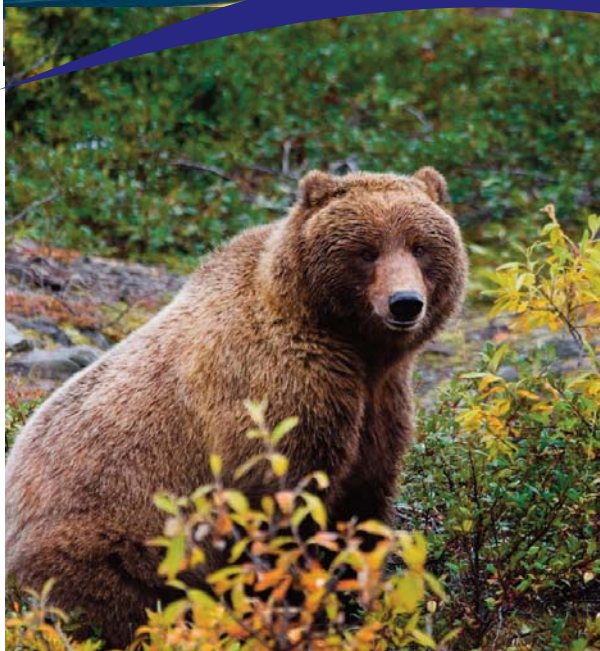

May 25, 2018 • Embark from Vancouver, British Columbia

Vancouver is a picturesque city nestled between the Pacific Ocean and the snowcapped peaks of the Coast Mountain range. Explore its unique neighborhoods from cobblestoned Gastown to exotic Chinatown and the West End. Here in Canada's third largest city, visitors can enjoy world class shopping, gourmet meals, live entertainment, theatre and outdoor adventure. Embark on the Celebrity Millennium this evening.

May 26 • Inside Passage (Cruising)

Cruising through the **Inside Passage** captures so much of what people love about Alaska: the pristine beauty of the Northern wilderness, glaciers the size of Rhode Island, misty rain forests, ghostly blue fjords, white-capped peaks and a landscape distinctively its own. Be sure to take in every view as you sail through one of the most beautiful parts of Alaska.

May 27 • Ketchikan, Alaska

Known as the "Gateway to Alaska," **Ketchikan** follows along the steep sloping shores of Tongass Narrows. Explore Creek Street, a historic boardwalk built on pilings over the water, and immerse yourself in history and the Indian culture at the Tongass Historical Museum, Totem Bight State Park and Saxman Village. Consider an optional flightseeing trip to breathtaking Misty Fjords National Monument.

May 28 • Icy Strait Point, Alaska

Icy Strait Point is located near the city of Hoonah, the largest native Tlingit Indian settlement in Alaska and not far from Glacier Bay National Park. Home to a historic cannery, the port's connection to the sea is strong. Locals share the sea with humpback whales, orcas, Dall porpoises, seals, sea otters, halibut and all five species of Pacific salmon. It is not uncommon to spot a humpback or an orca while walking along the shore.

May 29 • Juneau, Alaska

Founded during a gold rush in 1880, **Juneau** has maintained its rugged and pioneering style while developing a cosmopolitan side. Check out the State Capital as well as the Alaska State Museum with its collection of Russian Orthodox and Gold Rush relics. Nestled at the foot of Mt. Juneau and located on the Gastineau Channel, Juneau is surrounded by some of Alaska's most spectacular scenery, including the majestic Mendenhall Glacier nearby.

Tours and activities as described, other than optional activities, are included in your Cruisetour vacation from day June 1-4.

May 30 • Skagway, Alaska

During the 1898 Gold Rush to the Yukon, thousands of gold seekers disembarked ships at **Skagway** to begin the 600-mile trek to the goldfields. Take an optional train ride to the top of White Pass or explore Skagway's Historic District with its many restored buildings, including some with elaborate 2-story false fronts designed to make a business look more prosperous.

May 31 • Hubbard Glacier, Alaska (Cruising)

The longest river of ice in North America, the **Hubbard Glacier** is also one of the most active glaciers of its kind in Alaska. Perhaps you will have a chance to see the glacier "calving" as sheets of ice separate themselves from the ice field and crash into the sea, creating a huge booming crack resounding for miles. Our ships are specifically designed to allow you to be able to see this massive natural wonder—with its 1,350 square miles of blue ice—from just about anywhere on the ship.

June 1 • Seward/Anchorage/Denali, Alaska (Land)

After disembarking from the Celebrity Millennium at **Seward** this morning, you'll board a deluxe motorcoach and enjoy a scenic drive to **Anchorage** to meet your Adventure Specialist. Have lunch on your own before continuing on to the beautiful destination of **Denali**. Spend a relaxing night in Denali.

June 2 • Land Tour: Denali/Fairbanks, Alaska (Land)

In the morning, you'll depart on the **Denali Natural History Tour.*** Discover the beauty of taiga forests and gaze at miles of rolling tundra while searching for wildlife in the shadow of Mount McKinley. ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is per person based on double occupancy. When available, single rooms/cabins are often smaller than doubles. While we will try to match roommates, we cannot guarantee one will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 35 days prior to departure and, if one is not available or if you request a single, the single room/cabin charges is 200% of the cabin category price selected. Single staterooms are extremely limited and subject to confirmation.

PAYMENT:

A full deposit of \$200 per person is required. A second deposit of \$500 is due 9/17/17. If air is purchased, a third deposit of \$500 is required by 1/25/18. Final payment for trip, including optional travel protection premium if applicable, is due 2/24/18. Thereafter, a late payment fee of \$100 will be assessed. Prices offered within this brochure are based on a limited supply of staterooms.

REGISTRATIONS RECEIVED AFTER 10/9/17:

We welcome registrations after 1/25/18. Registrations received 1/26/18 - 2/24/18 will incur a \$100 per person fee. Registrations received between 2/25/18 - 3/11/18 will incur a \$200 per person fee. Registrations received 3/12/18 or later will incur an additional fee based on air availability. Additional fees will be advised upon registration.

CANCELLATION FEES:

100% of Cancellation Fees are covered by the optional Travel Protection Program, provided premium has been paid and reason for cancellation is insurable. Those who do not take travel protection should be aware of the following cancellation penalties: From day of registration to 121 days prior to departure, you will be charged the \$200 non-refundable administrative fee plus any airline fees. Additionally, thereafter, you will be charged any airline penalties and a single room supplement if your cancellation forces your roommate into a single plus the following charges: 124-31 days = 50% of total cost; 30 days to day of departure = 100% of total cost. Submit cancellation in writing. On or after day of departure, there will be no refund for any services not used.

FIT TO TRAVEL STATEMENT:

Passengers registering for the tour accept the responsibility for being in good health and able to walk and travel on the tour. Because many of the sites are not accessible to the physically challenged, those needing oxygen, wheelchairs, or other ambulatory assistance will find the tour extremely limiting to their experiences.

PRICE INCREASES:

All prices quoted in this brochure are subject to change prior to payment in full due to currency fluctuations, fuel surcharge increases, government taxes and fees increases or unforeseen circumstances. In addition, you may be subject to a price increase after payment in full has been received due to potential government imposed taxes and fees.

AIRLINE ROUTES and TICKETS:

In order to keep prices low, we do not guarantee the most direct routing to your final destination. Once "printed," airline tickets cannot be changed or refunded thereafter. Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class on IATA and ARC carriers utilizing APEX or SUPER APEX non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more flying together on entire itinerary.

FLIGHT TIMES:

All flights are subject to change by the airlines without advance notice. We are not responsible for such changes or delays and does not reimburse expenses resulting from such delays. If you are making your own flight arrangements to the departure city, we recommend you purchase a ticket that can be exchanged without large penalties.

ADDITIONAL AIRLINE FEES:

You will likely incur additional airline checked baggage fees that are not included in the price of the tour. These fees vary by airline and are at the airline's discretion on each segment of the flight itinerary. Additionally, you may incur optional fees i.e. food, excess baggage, overweight baggage, items of personal nature, etc.)

DEVIATIONS:

Deviations from the standard tour program must be submitted in writing and are subject to additional airline fees, if applicable. Transfers for passengers who deviate are not included.

ITINERARY CHANGES:

Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this brochure. While you will see all sites listed in this brochure, the order of sites and/or days and number of days may be altered to accommodate changes in airline, hotel schedules, and local conditions. Due to airline schedules, some participants may receive one or two extra leisure days at a nominal per day charge and some extensions may not be available on all departure dates. If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$125 per night; single rooms \$175 per night. Meals for extra nights are not included.

PREGNANCY/INFANT REGULATIONS

As to pregnancy, a woman cannot have begun her 24th week of pregnancy at any time before or during the cruise. If you are pregnant, please provide a medical note upon arrival at the pier for check-in from your physician stating your expected due date and medical fitness to travel. If you are in the 24th week or have completed it you will not be allowed to board. Because of the limited medical facilities, infants must be at least 24 weeks (6 months) of age on the first day of the cruise.

VALIDITY DATE:

This brochure is valid until 9/30/17. Registrations will still be accepted after the validity date.
