Greece Pre-Tour:

November 2 - Depart the USA on your flight to Athens, Greece.

November 3 - Arrive in Athens and transfer to your hotel.

November 4 - Corinth Canal, Mycenae, Epidaurus, lunch at a local restaurant. Dinner and overnight in Nauplion.

November 5 - Ancient Olympia site and museum, lunch at a local restaurant. Dinner and overnight in Delphi.

November 6 - Delphi site and museum, lunch at a local restaurant, meet the rest of the group in Athens.

Vienna to Zagreb Pre-Tour:

October 31 - Depart the USA on your flight to Vienna, Austria.

November 1 - Arrive in Vienna and transfer to your hotel.

November 2 - Vienna City Tour, Tour Schoenbrunn Palace, Vienna Walzy Dinner Concert

November 3 - Travel to Graz for city tour and free time, continue to Ljubljana for overnight.

November 4 - Ljubljana city tour, visit the castle, excursion to Lake Bled

November 5 - Zagreb city tour, folklore dinner evening

November 6 - Free day in Zagreb, transfer to the airport in the afternoon for your flight to Athens.

Egypt Post-Tour:

November 14 – Cairo

Fly from Athens to Cairo. Upon arrival, transfer to hotel for dinner and overnight.

November 15 – Giza

This morning visit Memphis and Sakkara then Afterwards, visit the Pyramids of Giza, constructed over 1,000 years before the birth of Moses. See the Great Sphinx and have the opportunity to ride a camel near the Pyramids.

November 16 – Alexandria

See the sights in Egypt's second-largest city, Alexandria. The large Jewish community that once called this area home wrote the Septuagint - a Greek translation of the Hebrew Bible. It was also home to the Great Library of Alexandria, which once held one of the most extensive collections of ancient texts. Make your way through Alexandria's side streets to the catacombs consisting of three burial chamber levels. Visit Pompey's Pillar, the largest triumphal column and the only known free-standing column of Roman Egypt. The amphitheater of Alexandria is one of the city's most distinguished highlights and is set within view of many modern structures. Glimpse the Citadel of Qaitbay, a 15th-century fortress situated on the northern tip of Pharos Island.

November 17 – Cairo

This morning visit the Egyptian Museum of Antiquities to view the unique collection of Pharaonic art and the renowned treasures of King Tutankhamen. Enjoy a felucca ride on the Nile. Tour the Old City and see the Citadel of Saladin, built in 1183 A.D., and view the Alabaster Mosque of Mohammed Ali. In Old Cairo, visit the Abu Serge Church built over the traditional site of the house where the Holy Family lived during their stay in Egypt.

November 18 – Transfer to the airport in Cairo for your flight home.

Morocco Post Tour:

November 14 - Corinth

Tour the city of Corinth, where the apostle Paul met fellow tentmakers Aquila and Priscilla and received a vision from the Lord saying, "I am with thee, and no man shall set on thee to hurt thee: for I have much people in this city". As Paul spoke, Crispus (chief ruler of the synagogue) and many others believed and were baptized, establishing the church at Corinth to whom Paul later wrote his two epistles. Discover the Archaeological Museum, Market Place and Temples. As you walk

among the ruins, stand on the Bema, where the apostle Paul stood before Gallio to face charges brought against him by the Jews.

November 15 - Fly to Morocco

Fly from Athens to Marrakech. Marrakech, this city is dated to the 11th century, is one of Morocco's most visited. Also known as the 'red city', Marrakech has numerous sites to visit such as one of the busiest squares in Africa, one of the largest "Souks" in the world as well as a very well maintained "Medina" or old city, visit of Marrakech: the exterior Koutoubia Mosque, the Menara Gardens and the magnificent Saadian Tombs. Lunch at dar Moha set within an 18th-century riad that was once the residence of renowned couturier Pierre Balmain, this Marrakech restaurant

captures the sophistication of Moroccan cuisine, offering a one-of-a-kind culinary experience. In the afternoon, enjoy the unique atmosphere in the souks and the famous Djamaa El Fna Square with numerous attractions such as dancers, acrobats, Snake charmers, performing monkeys and story tellers. Dive into an universe of Moroccan flavors in a dream setting, taste an exceptional dinner at Dar Yacout. The restaurant is considered the pearl of the city's restaurants. One of the oldest guest tables in Marrakech, the magic of this place is owed to Mohamed Zkhir who made it an unmissable stop for food lovers and gourmets in search of authentic experiences.

November 16 - Marrakech - Beni Mellal - Fez

After breakfast, continue to Beni Mellal, one of the fastest growing cities in Morocco. Positioned between the Middle Atlas Mountains, it is a great location for adventures in this region of the country. Enjoy lunch before continuing your journey to Fes for free time and overnight.

November 17 - Fez

Breakfast at the hotel is followed by a day exploring the fascinating city of Fez. Boasting more than 12 centuries of history, as well as a medina that is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and the oldest university in the planet, Fez is multifarious city renowned for the splendor of its faded glory. The medina, Fez el Bali, is a vast network of winding alleys hemmed in by ancient walls. Despite being car-free, the bustle, noise, shouting, smell of tanned leather, delicate aroma of oriental perfumes, barbecues, sweet pastry... all this creates a sense of movement and vibrancy that draws you deep into its soul. Head to the Nejjarine fountain where you can smell the

fragrant scent of cedar from the carpenters' district. The alleys are lined with places of study or prayers such as madrasahs. Visit of Karaouine Mosque from the outside. Lunch at Bab Sahara, the restaurant stands out for its peculiarity and can be admired with the respect reserved for a work of art. At first glance, it promises to live an immersive experience not only gastronomic, but in the authentic spirit that has characterized the customs of the country for hundreds of years. In the afternoon, continue through the rustic narrow streets of the Mellah, the former Jewish district, and head to the outskirts to see the Royal Palace and to enjoy the extraordinary panoramic view of the whole city offered by the fortifications of the north. Dinner at restaurant Palais Faraj, which offers fine dining, teaming up Moroccan and Mediterranean flavors with an equally matched list of Morocco's exquisite wines: the best in town.

November 18 - Fez - Volubilis - Meknes - Rabat

After breakfast, drive to nearby Volubilis, the site of the largest and best-preserved Roman ruins in Morocco. Drive to Meknes, founded in the 11th century by the Almorabidine dynasty as a military settlement. Meknes became a capital under Sultan Moulay Ismail (1672-1727), the founder of the Alawite dynasty. Visit the majestic gate Bab Mansour and explore the Moulay Ismail Mausoleum and the Royal Stables. Continue to Domaine de la Zouina for a wine tasting and lunch before ending your day in Rabat.

November 19 - Rabat - Casablanca

After breakfast, enjoy a short visit of Rabat, the administrative capital of Morocco. See the Royal Palace (exterior view) and the beautifully landscaped Chellah ruins, a Roman and medieval Muslim necropolis the Kasbah Oudayas, Hassan Tower, the Mausoleum of Mohammed V. Continue to Casablanca for lunch at Rick's café restaurant. The mythical saloon from the 1942 film "Casablanca" has finally been transformed from celluloid to wood, glass and plaster thanks to the imagination and determination of an American woman enamoured of Morocco, Kathy Kriger. After lunch visit Casablanca, the economical and industrial capital of Morocco. View the exterior of the monumental king Hassan II Mosque which is one of the biggest mosques in the world, Mohamed V Square, Anfa residential area, and beach promenade AinDiab.

November 20 - Transfer to the Casablanca Airport for your return flight home.
